- Firefighter and Technical Rescue Service staff members
- Volunteer Firefighter Association (local Volunteer Firefighter Organizations)
- Other rescue units





Firefighter and Technical Rescue Service (FTRS)

- Reports to the Ministry of the Interior
- Approx. 4000 staff members
- 8 districts District Firefighter and Technical Rescue Services
- > 115 firefighter departments
- 3 rescue squads
- Modules air, water, underground








CURRENT STATUS

- Firefighter and Technical Rescue
 Service: approx.
 40% full cover
- Approx. 30%partial cover
- Approx. 30% out of reach

CLASSIFICATION

- > A, B, C unit classes
- A: deployment 10 minutes (min. 1+3 firefighters and 2 vehicles),
- **B**: readiness 2 hours (1+3 firefighters), deployment 10 minutes with 1 vehicle
- **C**: readiness 2 hours (1+3), deployment 10 minutes







FINANCING

- Financing according to classes A, B, C
- Financing fuel
- Hazard pay
- Individual application
- Municipality budget
- Renewing used vehicles

CLASSIFICATION



Classification requirements for the Central Rescue Service:

- qualification of volunteer firefighter members
- proper firefighter hq-s
- operational firefighting vehicles
- proper protective gear
- other equipment
 - * Regulation: accepting the law of the Ministry of the Interior
